REMEMBERING 50 years of the Relief Sale in Kansas

“Love Must Be Genuine” was the theme of the 1997 Sale and appeared on 556 t-shirts, sweatshirts, and tote bags. Publicity for the sale was carried out by the usual distribution of mailings, press releases, and radio announcements, but also included an internet page with photos and extensive information. The internet page was put together by David Godshall of Hesston College. The weather was not favorable causing attendance to be down by about half, but the Sale proceeds were almost the same as the year before. The Quilt Auction was moved to the Industrial Building, which was heated. A singing group from Topeka “Personal Touch” performed on Friday evening. The theme was carried out by the way the volunteers pitched in and did the necessary things for the Sale to be a success. \$375,000 was donated for MCC’s work of genuine love.

The 1998 Sale was held with nice weather and a good crowd on both Friday night and Saturday. The Friday evening musical program was enjoyed by a large crowd. The theme for the sale was “Feed My Lambs”. It was observed and reported that most of the workers and volunteers were smiling and enjoying their work. The “House Against Hunger” was being constructed in Hutchinson. The project was not completed but was on its way by Sale date. Both auctions were blessed with good donations and successful auctions. The quilt auction was deemed a success because it was apparent people were bidding because they supported the cause of MCC. Items for sale in Building #4 ranged from a child’s play house that brought over \$3,000 to 15 loads of hedge wood averaging \$100 per load. 80 volunteers met at Moundridge High School to make bohne berogie. 504 pies were sold during the course of the Sale. The quilt auction sale total was \$150,472. Many volunteers and many smiles enabled the proceeds of the Sale to feed many lambs.

One of those events is a program with Mini Auction on Friday night, April 13, and featuring the vocals of the Kansas Mennonite Men’s Chorus. A scavenger hunt for all ages is being organized to help you find things and learn about the workings of the sale. We are providing a time capsule for each Church and Sale Committee to have the opportunity to put a memory into the capsule. The capsule will be opened at the Sale in 25 years. It is suggested that items for the time capsule be smaller than the area of a shoe box. Church Liaisons should bring item to the March monthly meeting. Finally, our brothers and sisters with MDS will be putting on their MCC hats and building a tool shed on the Fairgrounds during the Sale weekend. Construction will start on Friday at noon and the blitz build will be completed by Saturday noon. Sale attendees of all ages will be encouraged to pick up a hammer or a paint brush to help with the construction. The tool shed will be auctioned as part of the General Auction.
