

Good morning! My cousin Michelle and I (Laura) have led the Camp Washunga group for almost 4 years now and have had a really great time continuing this ministry. The last couple years though, we've had a couple of reoccurring conversations – one: how to encourage more junior highers to attend camp and two: how to continue the relationships that we get to have with these kids for longer than just a weekend in May. Some of you might remember, and many were a part of, the monthly or quarterly junior high events that were a part of the Goessel community for many years. Activities such as progressive suppers, fall bashes, Christmas parties and Camp Washunga were organized for junior highers to attend. Our dream is to bring back these quarterly events, with the goal being to answer the questions from those conversations we have been having – to encourage more junior highers to attend camp by making it a more familiar organization throughout the year and to foster longer lasting quality relationships with these kids.

How do we see this being setup? We want to give more continuity to the leadership of this group, so the idea would be to have 2 people from each church (not necessarily parents or a couple) that would serve as the leadership team. Responsibilities would include – planning events, providing transportation if needed, attending events and bringing excitement! Events will be held quarterly, with one of them being Camp Washunga, with minimal cost per junior higher. Michelle and I will help lead this group, but because we spend a large chunk of time working on camp, we would like to take a back seat with the planning of these events. But we have plenty of ideas! Our goal would be to start these events this fall (2019).

If serving with this ministry is something that would bring you joy or have ideas of people who you think would be a great fit, please let Michelle, myself, or one of the pastors know. If you or someone you know appreciated this ministry and you're excited about the possibility of bringing it back, please come talk to us! If you have other feedback or ideas we'd love to hear that, too!
